THE PATHWAY TO EXCELLENCE

1. Introduction to Tennis

Since 1999, more than 4,000 children have been introduced to the sport by JTCC at our facilities in College Park. In addition, 5,000 young athletes and students have been served by JTCC Community Outreach, while another 1,100 children have started the game of tennis at JTCC satellite facilities.

JTCC is also responsible for introducing tennis to more than 1,800 adults, who completed a series of three or six free and low-cost lessons. 42% of these players continued playing the sport and paying for more advanced programming.

2. Talent Development

JTCC is especially proud of the success our athletes have achieved. Thanks to a proven talent development model, 70 JTCC athletes participated in top level national tournaments in 2018. Additionally, 90 athletes have been ranked in the top 100 in the United States in their age group since the organization's founding.

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3. Achieving Excellence

Players in JTCC's pathway of introduction and talent development programs have achieved great things, both on and off the tennis court. Seven JTCC athletes have been ranked in the top 10 of the ITF World Junior rankings. JTCC graduates have received more than 17.5 million dollars in tennis scholarships over the past twenty years to a wide range of leading colleges and universities, including the University of Virginia, University of Michigan, UCLA, Duke and Vanderbilt. In addition, numerous JTCC alumni have earned need based and academic support totaling 2.5 million dollars from Division III and Ivy League schools such as Bowdoin, Claremont McKenna, Williams, Amherst, Harvard and Yale.
