

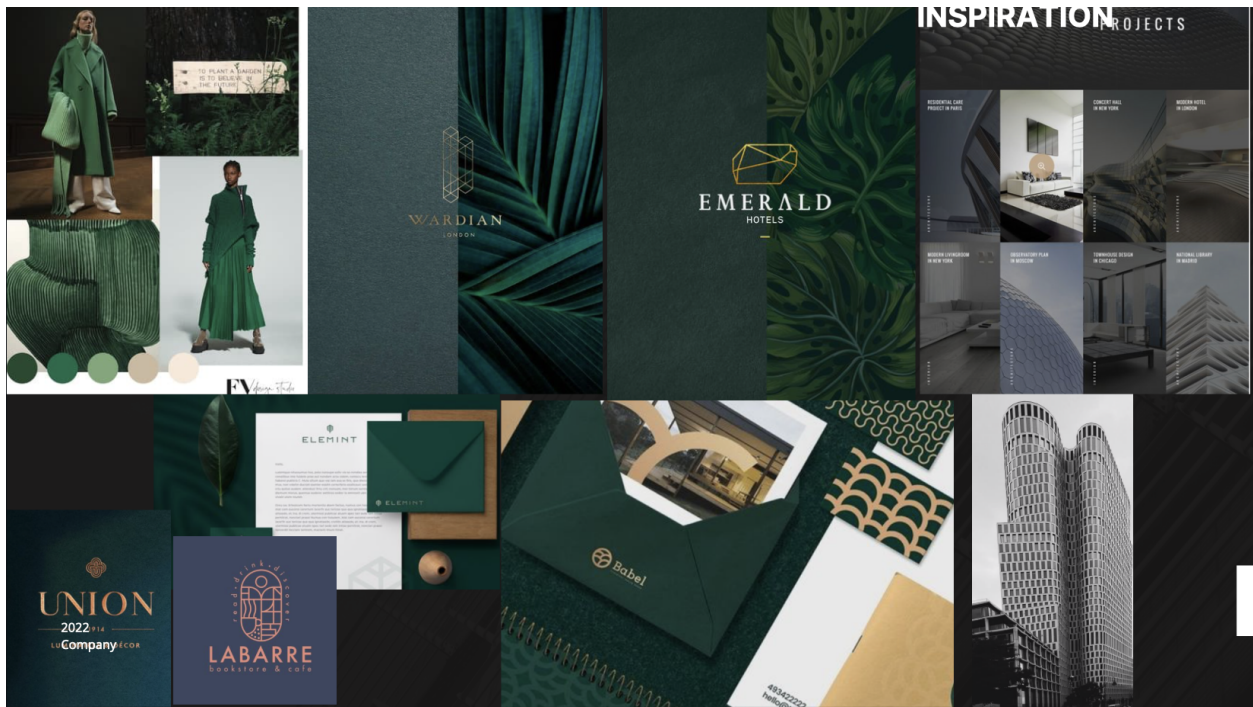

Cleopatra's Gemstone

The Foundation Stones and Emerald Symbolism

Emeralds also appear among the **foundation stones** of the Heavenly City in the New Testament Book of **Rev elation**. The Archbishop Rabanus Maurus of Mainz (786-856 CE) wrote about the significance of the twelve Apocalyptic gems. "In the emerald is expressed the strength of faith in adversity," he said.

According to Indian mythology, the name emerald was first translated from Sanskrit as "marakata," meaning "the green of growing things."
