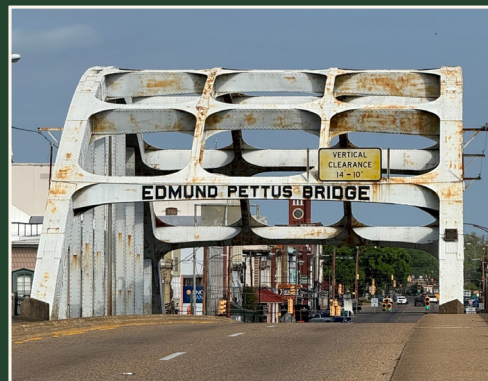

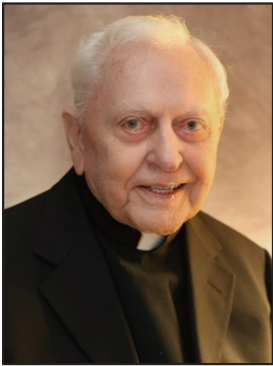
Legacy Museum, Montgomery

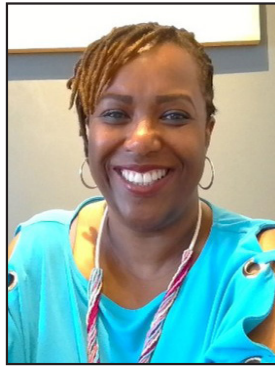

Our Spiritual Co-Leaders

Msgr. John A. Wall

Msgr. Wall is a seasoned pilgrimage leader who has led thousands of pilgrims to sacred destinations around the world over his long tenure in ministry. In his role as Spiritual Co-Leader, he views the period of civil rights struggle from a unique perspective. As a high school student in Greensboro, North Carolina, he witnessed the world press's response to Bishop Vincent S. Waters's decision to integrate all Catholic churches, schools, and hospitals across the Diocese of Raleigh. The year was 1953, one year before *Brown vs. Board of Education* and more than a decade before passage of the Civil Rights Act.

Msgr. Wall recalls the world's reaction, while he was studying for the priesthood in Rome, Italy, to the integration of the lunch counter at Woolworth's in his hometown of Greensboro on July 25, 1960, one of the turning points of the civil rights struggle. Early in his priesthood, while serving as a rector of a boys' school in Asheville, North Carolina, he recalls marching with students and other community members following Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s assassination in April 1968. In the Spring of 2025, Msgr. Wall toured many of the sites on our pilgrimage with Scott Scherer, president of Catholic Travel Centre, planting the seeds for our *Long Road to Freedom* pilgrimage.

Dr. Latonya L. Agard

Dr. Agard is a native of Montgomery, Alabama and currently resides in the Triangle area. Her experience growing up in the South will provide our group with a rich perspective on the Civil Rights Movement. Throughout our pilgrimage, in addition to serving as a Spiritual Co-Leader, Dr. Agard will play a key role in facilitating our group discussions.

As a servant-leader in the Christian community, she has held positions, including Associate Minister, Pastor of Congregational Care, Senior Pastor, and most-recently church planter of Transformation Fellowship Christian Church (TFCC). Her vision for Christian ministry is for believers to grow in their relationship with Christ so that they are empowered, equipped, and encouraged to call others into a life-giving relationship with our Lord.

Our Group Co-Coordinators:

Ms. MJ Bettman and Ms. Margaret Cross are good friends who together have stepped forward to serve as our Group Co-Coordinators for this pilgrimage and will help to organize our group in the leadup to our departure.

OUR DAILY ITINERARY

Thursday, November 5, Day 1: Arrive in Birmingham / Transfer to Montgomery: Welcome & Dinner

Welcome to Birmingham! Travelers will make their own travel arrangements to Birmingham and we will establish a meeting point at Birmingham Airport where you will meet your motor coach at 2:00 pm and transfer to our hotel in Montgomery, about a two-hour ride.

If you prefer to fly directly into Montgomery, upon arrival at Montgomery Regional Airport you can take a taxi directly to our centrally located Elevation Convening Center and Hotel, owned and operated by the Equal Justice Initiative (EJI). Check-in time at the hotel is 3:00pm. We gather at 6:00pm for a welcome reception and orientation, followed by a dinner at our hotel. (D)

Note: If you wish to arrive a day early in Montgomery, you will need to make your own pre-night reservation by going to the hotel's website. Be sure to book your pre-night reservation in the same category of room as our group's reservation: Deluxe Category Room.

Friday, November 6, Day 2: Montgomery: Panoramic City Tour plus Excursion to Selma

We begin with a panoramic tour of the city of Montgomery with our local guide. The city entered the nation's conscience when Rosa Parks refused to give up her seat on a segregated bus on December 1, 1955. Thereafter, Montgomery remained at the forefront of the Civil Rights Movement.

Our introductory tour will orient us to the city and provide some background on the history of the Confederacy, which began here. We will visit the parsonage of Dexter Avenue King Memorial Baptist Church (*pending confirmation*). The parsonage appears as it did when Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and his family resided here during Dr. King's pastorate from 1954-1960. The parsonage was bombed several times during the fight for civil rights, but fortunately no one was injured. From here, Dr. King helped to organize the Montgomery Bus Boycott.

Nearby the King's home, we view from outside the house of Dr. Richard Harris. During the siege at First Baptist, Dr. Harris opened his home to 33 activists who had been attacked at the bus station, serving as a haven during martial law. Civil rights leaders, including Dr. King and Rev. Ralph Abernathy, met there to plan the continuation of the Freedom Rides.

After some time for lunch on our own, we set out for Selma. Our first stop enroute to Selma is the Lowndes Interpretive Center for an audiovisual introduction to the Selma-to-Montgomery March. Then we arrive in Selma and view the Brown Chapel AME Church in Selma (currently under renovation), a National Historic Landmark built in 1908 and the pivotal staging ground for the 1965 Selma to Montgomery voting rights marches. It served as the SCLC headquarters, hosting mass meetings preceding the Voting Rights Act of 1965. The church was the assembly point for voting rights protesters on March 7, 1965 ("Bloody Sunday"), and again on March 21, 1965.

Next, we walk across Edmund Pettus Bridge. Built in 1940, it is named for Edmund Pettus, a former Confederate brigadier general, US senator, and state-level leader of the Alabama KKK. After, we will have some time to meet with the local Edmundite Missions, based in Selma. The Edmundites have been serving the men, women and children living in poverty-stricken communities throughout the Deep South since 1937. We return to Montgomery. Discussion and dinner follow. (D)

Saturday, November 7, Day 3: Montgomery: Montgomery Park, Legacy Museum & Tuskegee Airmen's Museum

We begin our morning at Montgomery Park, which will provide us with a timeline of the key events that took place in the city between 1955 and 1965. We continue to the Legacy Museum, a project pioneered by the Equal Justice Initiative (EJI). The EJI provides legal representation to prisoners who may have been wrongly convicted, poor prisoners without effective representation, and others denied a

fair trial. Built on the site of a former cotton warehouse where enslaved Black people were forced to labor, the Legacy Museum tells the story of slavery in America and its legacy through interactive media, first-person narratives, art, and data-rich exhibits.

We will have time for lunch on our own in the nearby restaurants. This afternoon we board our motor coach for the Tuskegee Airmen National Historic Site, home of the country's first African American military aviators, who fought in WWII. We will join the City of St. Jude Catholic Community in the celebration of the Saturday evening Vigil Mass, then return to our hotel for discussion and dinner. (D)

Sunday, November 8, Day 4: Montgomery: Dexter Avenue King Memorial Baptist Church, National Memorial for Peace & Justice, and Freedom Monument Sculpture Park

We begin our day by joining the local community for Sunday worship at Dexter Avenue King Memorial Baptist Church, where Rev. King accepted the call to pastor while completing his doctoral studies in systematic theology at Boston University. He was installed in October 1954 and served until 1960. After church services we will have some time for lunch on our own.

This afternoon we visit National Memorial for Peace and Justice, the nation's first comprehensive memorial dedicated to the legacy of Black Americans who were enslaved, terrorized by lynching, humiliated by racial segregation, and presumed guilty and dangerous. More than 4,400 Black people killed in lynchings between 1877 and 1950 are remembered here. The memorial is a sacred space for truth-telling and reflection on racial terrorism and its legacy.

Our day concludes at the Freedom Monument Sculpture Park, overlooking the Alabama River. At this 17-acre site along the very river where tens of thousands of enslaved people were trafficked, breathtaking art and original artifacts invite an immersive, interactive journey and provide a unique view into the lives of enslaved people.

At the end of the day, we will meet with a member of the Equal Justice Initiative team for discussion. Dinner follows. (D)

Monday, November 9, Day 5: Montgomery: Rosa Parks & Holt Street Church Museum, plus Freedom Rides Museum and Civil Rights Memorial / Birmingham

We check out of our Montgomery hotel and begin our day at the Rosa Parks Museum, which contains artifacts of the Montgomery Bus Boycott. The museum was built in Rosa Parks' honor so that visitors could come to know her story. We explore the history of the 381-day Montgomery Bus Boycott, which planted the seeds for the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), founded by Rev. Ralph Abernathy, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., and others as an outgrowth of the Montgomery Improvement Association (MIA). The SCLC was created to replicate the success of the Montgomery Boycott throughout the South, transitioning the local effort into a broader regional movement.

We continue to the Holt St. Church Museum, the church where Dr. King delivered the speech that would launch the Montgomery Bus Boycott on the heels of Rosa Parks' arrest. His speech cast him into the spotlight as the leader of the Boycott. We will hear a recording of King's speech in the very church it was first delivered and after, we will have some time for lunch on our own.

We continue to the Freedom Rides' Museum located at 210 South Court Street in Montgomery, formerly the Montgomery Greyhound Bus Station. It was the site of a violent attack on the Freedom Riders on May 20, 1961. Before departing Montgomery, we stop at the Civil Rights Memorial, created by Maya Lin as a Southern Poverty Law Center project. The structure commemorates 41 Civil Rights Movement martyrs.

Aboard our motor coach, we make our way north to Birmingham. Birmingham stands at the heart of the Civil Rights Movement, most famously through Project C, better known as the Birmingham Campaign. Peaceful lunch counter sit-ins, boycotts, and marches that were met with

violence are widely recognized as a turning point in the Civil Rights Movement. We check in to the hotel. Discussion and dinner follow. (D)

Tuesday, November 10, Day 6: Birmingham City Tour: Dynamite Hill, Bethel Baptist, 16th Street Baptist, Kelly Ingram Park and Civil Rights Institute

Our panoramic tour of the city includes Dynamite Hill, a section in Birmingham so nicknamed because Ku Klux Klan members regularly bombed its streets during the Civil Rights era. We continue to Bethel Baptist Church. The church served as headquarters from 1956 to 1961 for the Alabama Christian Movement for Human Rights (ACMHR) led by the Rev. Fred Shuttlesworth. ACMHR focused on legal and nonviolent direct action against segregated accommodations, transportation, schools and employment discrimination, and it played a crucial role in the 1961 Freedom Rides, a fitting place to close our Civil Rights Pilgrimage.

We come to 16th Street Baptist Church, the first Black church in Birmingham. W.E.B. DuBois, Mary McLeod Bethune, Paul Robeson, and Ralph Bunche were among the noted Black Americans who spoke there during its early years. During the 1960s, the church served as headquarters for civil rights mass meetings and rallies.

On Sunday, September 15, 1963, at 10:22 a.m., the church became known around the world when a bomb planted by members of the KKK exploded, killing four young girls attending Sunday school and injuring over 20 other members of the congregation.

Across the street, we visit the Kelly Ingram Park, the 1963 civil rights campaign's epicenter and a pivotal assembly point for demonstrations against segregation. The park was the site of brutal police attacks, including the use of fire hoses and dogs against protesters, notably during the Children's Crusade. It is now a site honoring Civil Rights Movement leaders.

Our tour concludes at Birmingham Civil Rights Institute, a comprehensive museum and educational center depicting the events of the 1963 Birmingham campaign, including the Children's Crusade and other milestones of the Civil Rights Movement in the 1950s and 1960s. The afternoon is at our leisure. We gather for discussion and dinner this evening. (D)

Wednesday, November 11, Day 7: End of Our Pilgrimage Together

Travelers will arrange their own transfers to Birmingham-Shuttlesworth International Airport.

Note: *This is our proposed itinerary and all visits are subject to confirmation. Although no changes are anticipated, adjustments may become necessary. Some included-dinners might be changed to included-lunches instead, depending on the final flow of the itinerary. Venue descriptions above might include text borrowed directly from museum and venue websites.*

Final payment is due 120 days prior to departure, by **July 11, 2026**. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

ACCEPTANCE OF TERMS & CONDITIONS: Any payments made by a Traveler or on behalf of the Traveler ("Traveler", "you") to Catholic Travel Centre (CTC) toward any CTC tour shall constitute acceptance of all Terms & Conditions provided herein.

PAYMENT TERMS: All payments shall be made on the dates indicated in the payment schedule, noted in the Registration Information section. Late payments are subject to a non-refundable \$150 fee, and may result in cancellation. A Traveler registering within 120 days prior to departure must provide full payment by cashier check, plus a non-refundable late registration \$150 fee. CTC reserves the right to cancel registrations not paid in full 105 days prior to tour departure and to charge fees per the Cancellation Policy. A non-refundable \$75 fee is charged on all returned payments. Travelers agree not to dispute any credit card charges associated with this trip before contacting CTC first to resolve their concerns. CTC retains the right to dispute any chargeback that is improper and recover any costs, including attorney's fees related to improper chargebacks. Additionally, in the event of an improper chargeback, CTC retains the right to cancel any travel reservation related to that improper chargeback. **NOTE:** Credit card charges will not show as "travel expense" on your credit card statement, but will appear as "specialty services", "shopping" or another designation.

CHANGES IN FORM OF PAYMENT: To change from Cash Discount to Standard pricing, the difference between prices plus an additional \$75 fee applies. After a Traveler's credit card has been charged for any portion of the tour, s/he is ineligible for the Cash Discount Price.

PARTIAL PACKAGES NOT AVAILABLE: Tour Packages are offered as described in this brochure, at the stated price. Partial package purchase is not available.

INDIVIDUAL CANCELLATION POLICY: CTC's cancellation policy is in effect upon first payment toward any CTC tour. A Traveler's cancellation must be provided in writing either by email, fax, or registered mail to CTC. The cancellation by the Traveler is effective on the date of the cancellation email, fax, or date of postmark. The Traveler forfeits the following fees to CTC based on the date of cancellation notice: anytime up to 120 days prior to departure, \$500 fee; 119 to 90 days prior to departure, \$500 fee plus 25% of Land Cost; 89 to 60 days prior to departure, \$500 fee plus 50% of Land Cost; 59 days or fewer, all payments by Traveler made to CTC are forfeited, and there are no refunds. In event of individual cancellation, no name changes or substitutions are permitted. **No shows:** Passengers who do not show for first hotel night will be considered as tour cancellations: their hotel reservations will automatically be cancelled and cannot be reinstated.

PRICES: If the group does not reach the size advertised, the price or programming will be adjusted accordingly. Final price subject to any fuel surcharges for motor coach provider. Any fuel surcharges are the responsibility of the traveler and will be charged at the time of final payment
