

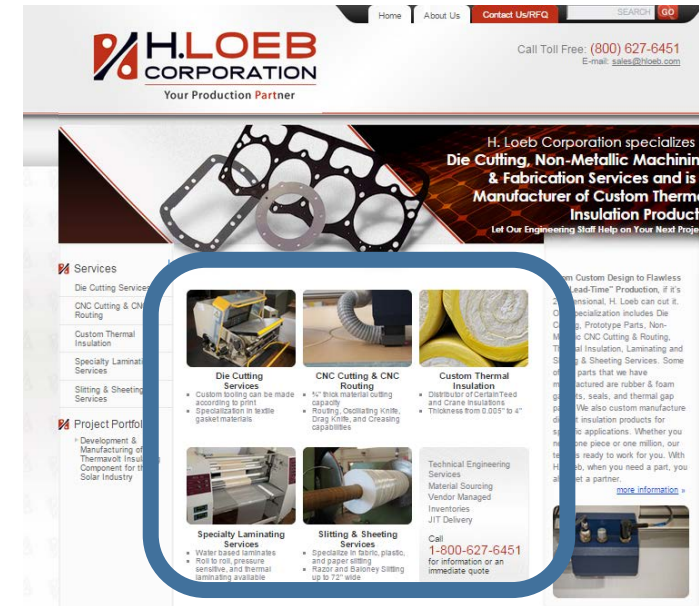
# Capability “icon”, “line drawing”, sketch

Example Sketch. Use two colors to differentiate the machine and raw material from the part being made.

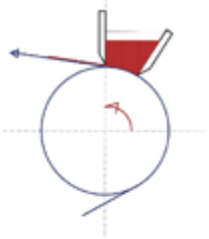

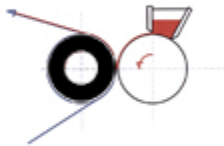

Knife or roll-over-roll:

The most common coating technique, either direct onto the carrier or onto a paper or filmic liner.



Reverse Roll:

Preferred for coating where the adhesive could go through the carrier, eg cloth.



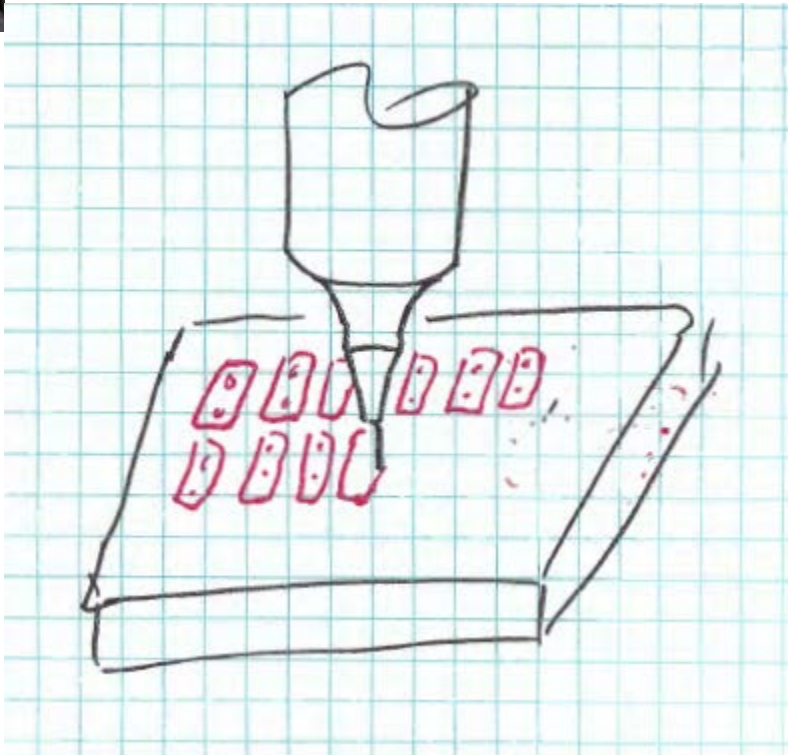
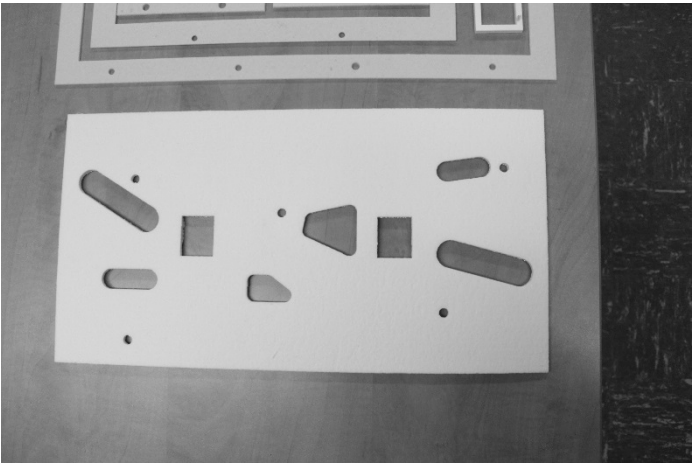
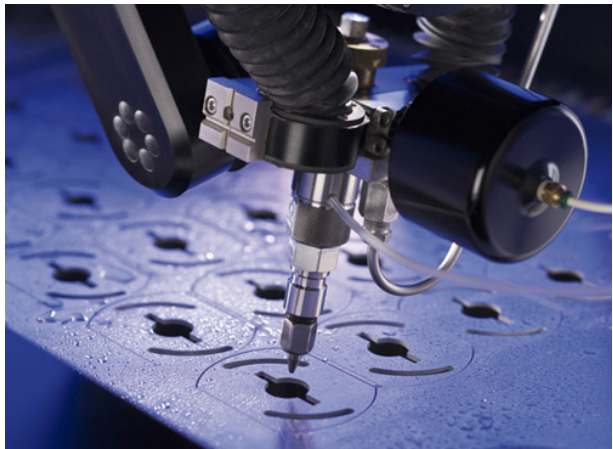
Gravure, Meyer Bar:

Often used for coating release or primer in low viscosity systems, and for patterned adhesives.



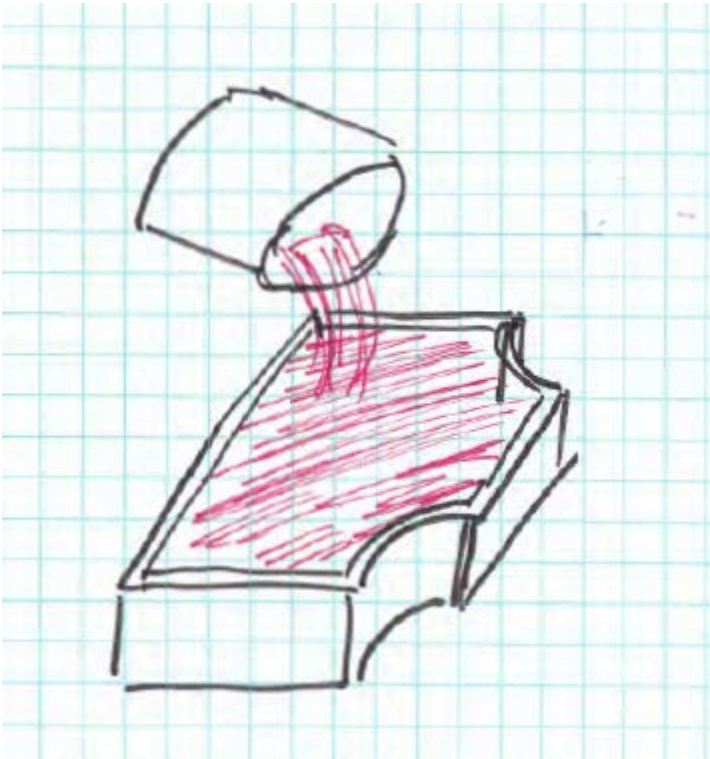
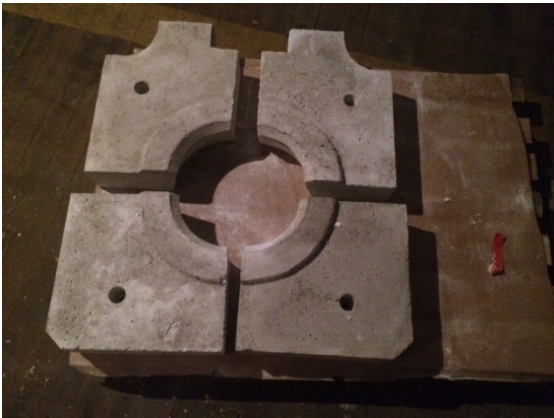


Waterjet line drawing/icon

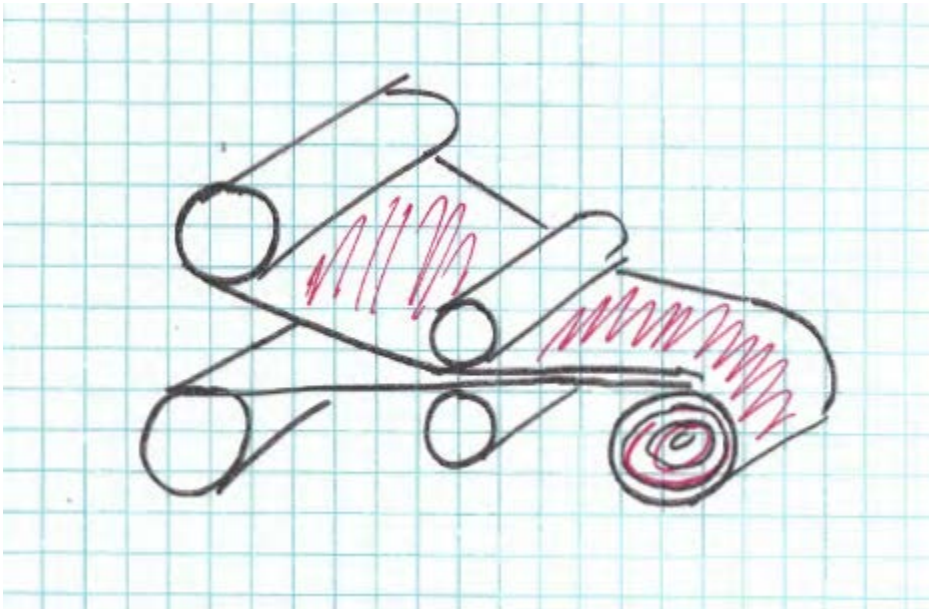
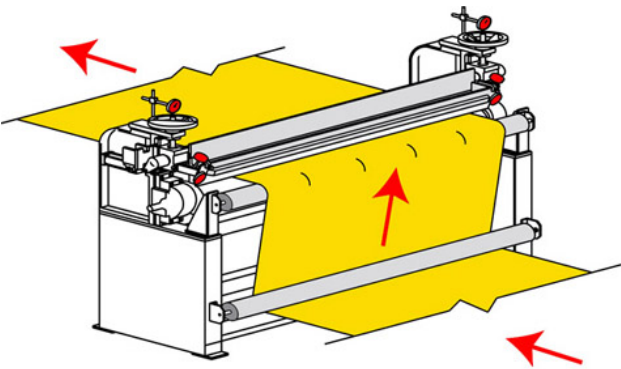




Casting line drawing/icon

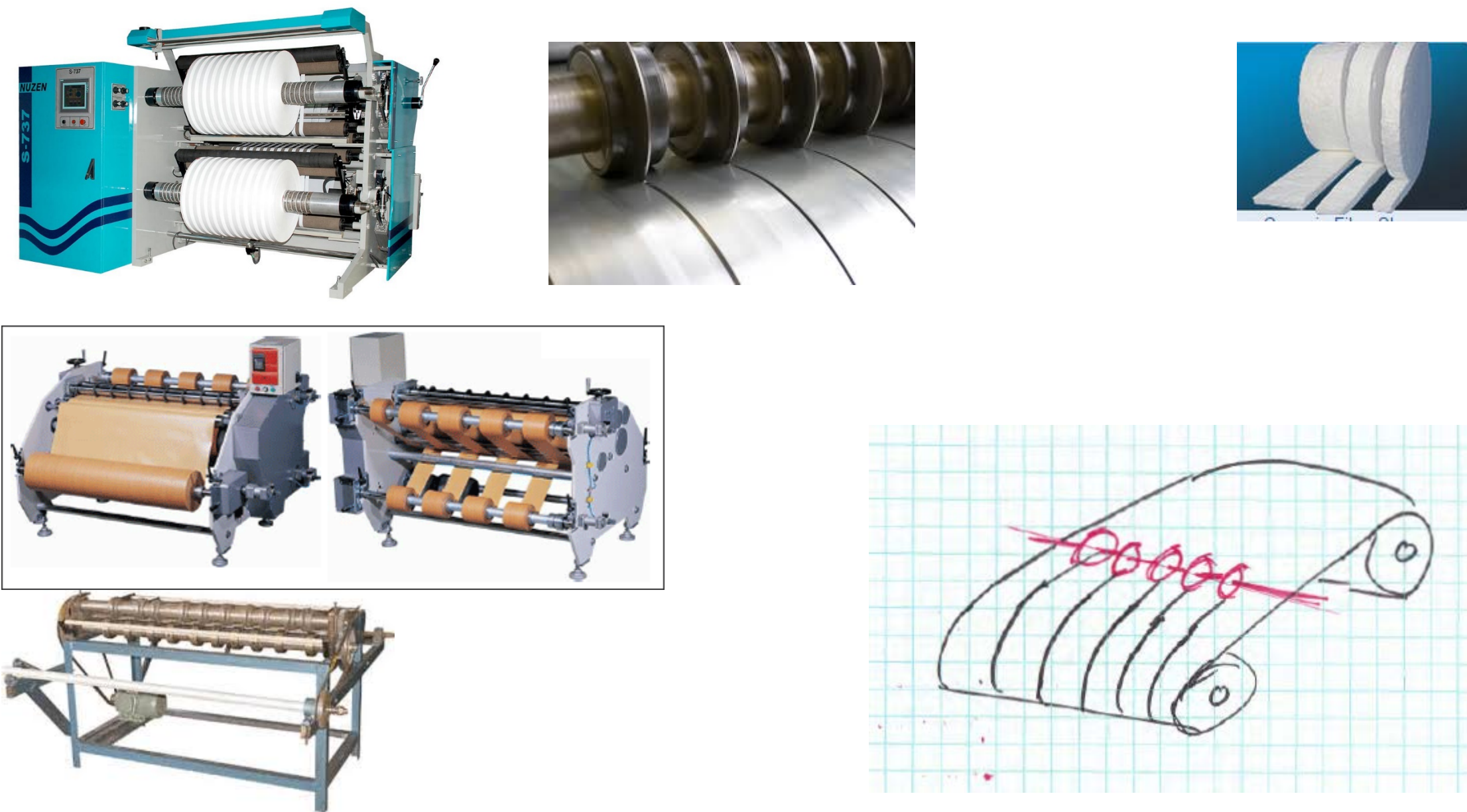


Laminating line drawing/icon

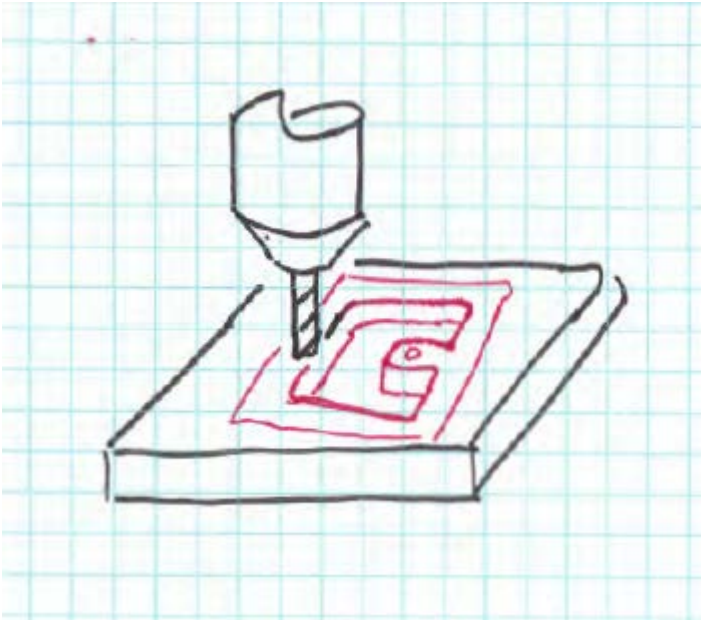




Slitting line drawing/icon

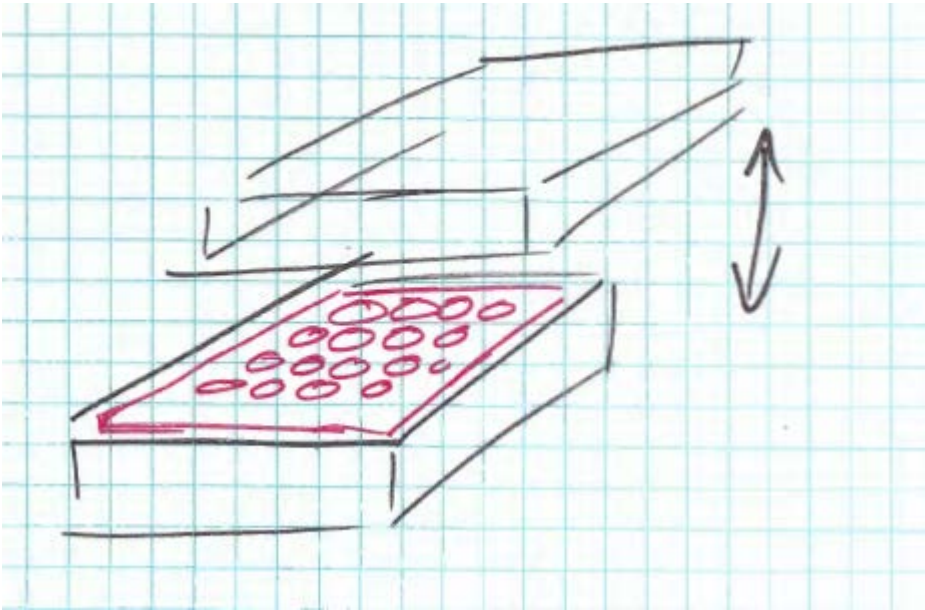
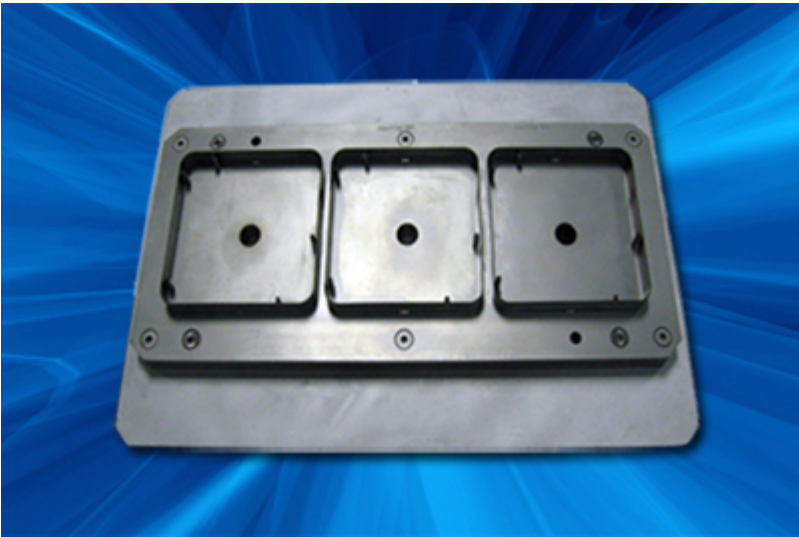


CNC Machining line drawing/icon
