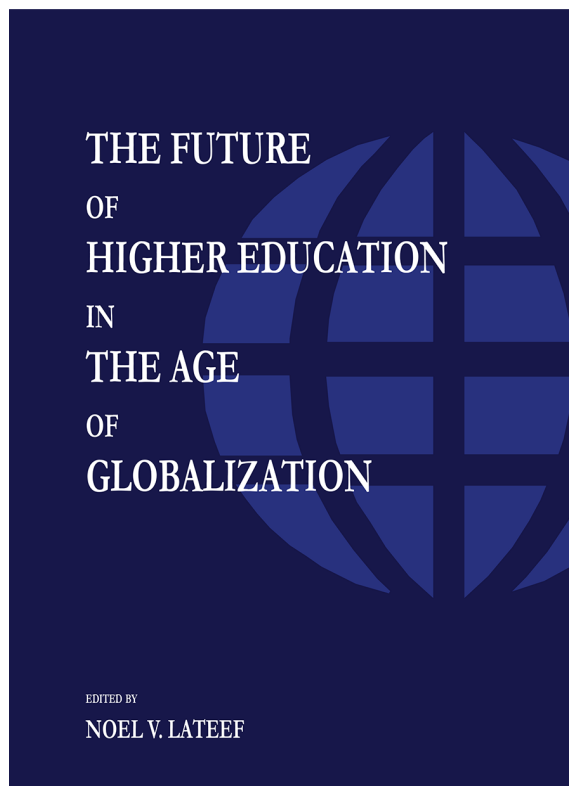
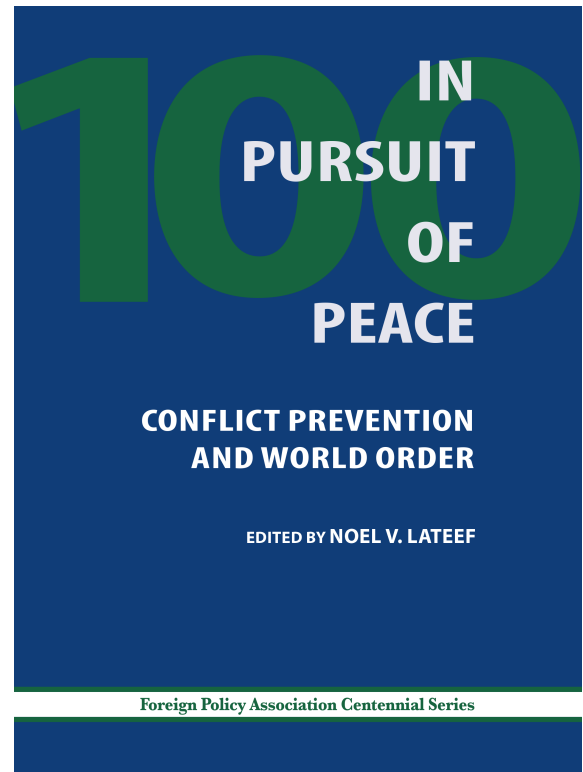
In Pursuit of Peace
