

Patient oriented research curriculum for children, families and clinician scientists in child health (PORCCH)



- Is a collaborative effort involving patients and families, health care professionals, clinician scientists, and educational researchers from CCHCSP, SickKids, Holland Bloorview, Ontario Child Health Support Unit and the Ottawa Methods Centre
- To develop and build an interactive on-line curriculum on patient-oriented research housed on the Canadian Child Health Clinician Scientist Program website (www.cchcsp.ca)
- With an overarching goal of enhancing skills and capacity in patient-oriented health research among patients and families, clinicians, trainees, and scientists
- Supported by an OSSU Patient-Oriented Research Capacity Building Initiatives Award and the Ontario Child Health Support Unit

Modules will cover the following topics:

- 1. Research 101 for patients and families**
- 2. Steps to engaging patients in research in the full breadth of environments that Ontario patients and families experience**
- 3. Ethics for patient-oriented research.**
- 4. How to search for appropriate sources of research evidence, including key types of pre-appraised research evidence**
- 5. Use of AMSTAR to assess the quality of a systematic review**
