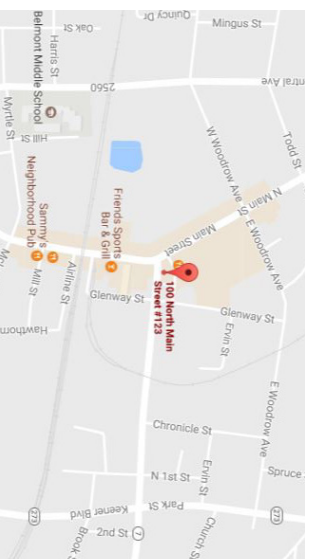

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SYMPTOMS OF HEARING LOSS

Hearing loss increases over time and can go unnoticed for years, so it's important to be aware of the symptoms.

- Frequently asking people to repeat themselves
- Having the TV volume louder than your family likes it
- Mistaking speaking for mumbling when people are not looking directly at you
- Avoiding social situations or activities
- Tinnitus – annoying and recurring ringing or buzzing sound
- Difficulty hearing on the telephone

These new devices allow you to:

- Stay active by automatically adjusting to different sound environments

DID YOU KNOW?

- Cognitive impacts, such as poor memory and decreased ability to learn new tasks, could be related to hearing loss.
- One out of three individuals over age 65 has hearing loss.
- Some medical treatments can increase the likelihood of hearing loss, including cisplatin chemotherapy, diuretics and some antibiotics, like streptomycin and gentamycin.
- Hearing loss causes patients to avoid social situations and miss important information during conversations at home, work and with loved ones.
- Hearing loss is the third most prevalent disabling but treatable condition.
- Medical conditions such as hypertension and diabetes are common causes of hearing loss.
