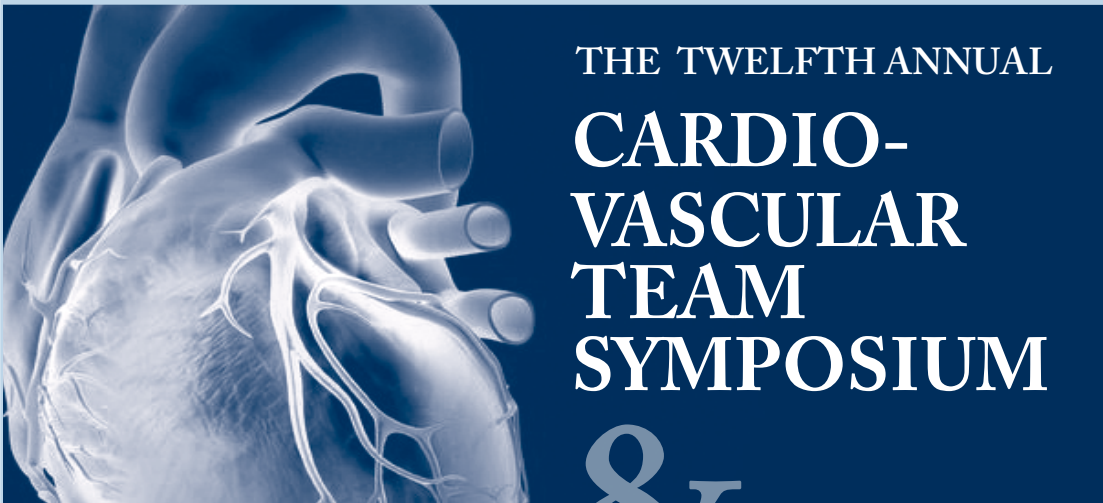

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION AND TARGET AUDIENCE

Demand for cardiac care continues to increase due to the aging population, the obesity epidemic and the persistent incidence of cardiovascular disease in the population. At present, CVD is still by far the most common diagnosis among all hospital discharges in the United States. Chronic disease will become an important component of cardiology practice and care teams, consisting of nurses, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, pharmacists and physicians, and will provide the most efficient means of providing ongoing care and long-term follow-up and management of cardiovascular patients. The 12th Annual Cardiovascular Team Symposium is a unique academic event designed to enhance current knowledge about the etiology, prevention, intervention and management of cardiovascular disease. Presentations will provide cardiovascular team members with evidence-based approaches to the treatment and care of the cardiac patient and information regarding current and cutting-edge technologies. - Identify specific patient populations that would benefit from LDL-C lowering utilizing PCSK9i therapies
- Apply the guidance from the latest clinical recommendations for the use of PCSK9i
- Implement strategies to overcome common obstacles and potential solutions to increase patient access to PCSK9i
- Discuss how advanced cardiac imaging can be used for the diagnosis of infiltrative cardiomyopathies and to monitor response to medical therapy
- Summarize treatment options, including novel medical therapies and advanced heart failure surgical therapies, that are available for patients with infiltrative cardiomyopathy
