I was 8 years old. My mom had just committed suicide. My home life was in shambles and I was experiencing more than what most adults experience. I was on a quick road to destruction. My mom's family had always been connected to Wyldewood and so that summer they sent me. I instantly connected with Rebecca Gowen and she became my second mom. Wyldewood became my home away from home. I knew when I went to Wyldewood, I didn't have to worry about the stuff happening back home. I camped many sessions during the summer and eventually became a counselor.

Wyldewood saved my life. It is the reason I am who I am today. Every single counselor and staff member who poured into me made me the woman, wife, and mother I am today. I am just one of the many stories exactly like this. Wyldewood is so much more than a church camp. There are so many kids that come that have a story so similar to mine. If it were not for all the counselors, staff, and volunteers, I would not be who I am today.

Rebecca and I go back every summer to volunteer and this summer I brought my husband with me. He had never been to a church camp and didn't understand the hype. Before we left, he said, "we have to come back the same week next year." Camp can't exist without volunteers. Every single person matters. It doesn't matter if you work canteen or work in the kitchen, you make a difference. Don't be fooled, camp is not just about what you can do for others. It is the best place to fill your cup and get back to your relationship with Christ.

Title: Where Are They Now

Subtitle: Interview with Robert Humphries

How did you find out about Camp Wyldewood?

I found out about Camp Wyldewood from a lovely lady Carole, who worked in the counseling offices at Freed-Hardeman University. She had worked at Wyldewood several years earlier and was recruiting FHU students for Coach Groover. She saw me interviewing with a couple other Christian camps at a FHU jobs fair and convinced me along with two other of my friends to consider Camp Wyldewood. I attended the counselor orientation week and fell in love with the beauty of the place, the atmosphere, and the dedicated staff.

What years did you attend Wyldewood?

I was fortunate to work at Wyldewood for parts of 15 summers, 1981-1995. I started out as a counselor in groups 1 & 2 and later became a group leader for Groups 2, 3 & 4. The greater part of my years were spent as the Group 4 leader. My sessions on "staff" were varied. Since I had my Red Cross certificate, I did a little life-guarding, as well as driving the bus for Day Camp, banker, gopher, and manual laborer. I remember begging Coach for years to let me be the dishwasher and I finally received that honor for one session as well.

How would you describe Coach Grover and what he meant to you?

For those that never had the good fortune to know Coach Groover, there was no better mentor that I ever knew. Coach had a humble and meek spirit as well as being witty and insightful. He was a Godly man, passionate about camp, committed to helping each worker to grow, and of course spiritually encouraging all the young people who chose to spend part of their summers at Wyldewood. I believe Coach was at his best when the children's homes were present at camp. He had great empathy for those kids, but also saw the promise that each one had in them. He would spend extra time at camp those weeks sitting on the benches outside during meal times just to get the opportunity to speak with each of them. And they all knew Coach. Coach was also a great respecter of camp traditions and of those who had come before him. He spoke often and admirably

about Brother Dykes and his wife who had spent their own money and years of hard work in the making of Camp Wyldewood.

What is one of your fondest memories of your time at Wyldewood?

I had often wanted to meet the Dykes family. One of my fondest and most rewarding memories (thanks, Sandi Clarke) was taking Group 4 to the Dyke's home during our "Harding night out"...after all, I had the bus keys! I remember almost all the counselors and campers leaving in tears, having shared their gratitude to the Dykes family for the enduring sacrifices that they had made in creating such a place that was a great inspiration in all the lives of those who came later. We were able to continue that tradition for a couple years more before Brother Dykes passed away. I understand that in later years, other groups paid the same respects to Coach Groover and Mildred. I'm sure Coach loved that as well.

There are so many other memories of events and people at Wyldewood that still hold a place in my heart, although too many people to name. There was the time that we went to the LR airport to pick up 26 Spanish-only speaking kids from a Texas congregation where a wealthy benefactor had paid for them to fly and attend camp for a session. What an opportunity for adventure for those kids as well as our staff. My favorite time of the day was the singing on the steps before the nightly devotionals on Canteen Field, as well as the Sunday night staff singing. The acoustics seemed perfect, and everyone's voices shared in glorifying God while also encouraging each other in song. Many a camper led their first song from the steps. I was grateful to be a part of it all.

What have you been doing since your time at Wyldewood?

Since my Wyldewood days, I have continued teaching school in Germany. I'd have to say the highlight of my time since then was adopting a 7 year old son from Guatemala 15 years ago. David is currently a senior studying sports medicine in Virginia and plans to become a Physical Therapist. I had hoped that he would also become a life-long camper, but he's very much a city boy. He spent one week at Wyldewood's Day Camp in 2005. He loved everything but the chiggers, ticks and mosquitoes- which we don't have in Germany- but the snake on the trail sealed the deal. No more camp for him. We spent the next couple years at Harding's soccer camp instead.

Any final thought you would like to share?

Wyldeewood has held a special place in my heart. I know that it has had many great campers and leaders in the years that have passed since Coach Groover. My wish is that it continues to serve as an inspiration and a place of hope and service and growth in the lives of many to come in the following generations. As we always parted on the last night, may "The Lord bless you and keep you."

Those moments are so precious to me because they are filled with God's beautiful and perfect presence. People who were once strangers are now the closest friends I've ever known. Morning Praise brings the most joyous worship I've ever expressed. Seeing beautiful nature and feeling it in the bites down my legs is the most amazed I've ever been at God's creation. It's here in these moments that I truly experienced God for the very first time.

Camp Wyldeewood is the reason I have the faith that I have today. The outlet that Camp is for me (and I believe many others) has been essential in the process of my growth as a Christian. Though many can give guidance along the way, it is up to each child to ultimately develop their own relationship with Christ. Camp Wyldeewood encouraged me to make my faith my own. It was a breath of fresh air when I needed it most. Just when the stress of life became (almost) too much to handle, God gave me that sweet little place in Searcy to open my heart and lift my spirits. From there, He worked on me until I was ready to face the world again. The impact
